

Calculator Policy
for the
QLO1
(September, 2006)

Almost any multifunction calculator may be used on the Quantitative Literacy exams (QLO1).

Graphing capability is recommended, and programmability is acceptable.

You are allowed to use a calculator if you are taking a math or science assessment. The TI82, TI83, TI83+, TI84 and TI84+ models are allowed by the parameters set forth by WGU. Calculators with fewer functions are also acceptable.

In the past, there has been confusion surrounding the acceptability of programmable calculators and this new policy is designed to clear up that confusion – *almost any* calculator may be used.

Here are the exceptions: Calculators NOT allowed: NO calculator with a Computer Algebra System (CAS) is allowed. EX: TI86, TI89, TI92, TI94, HP48, HP49, Voyage 200.
